"From an economical standpoint, there's a statistic that says for every dollar spent on prevention programs, like HHH, there's \$7 to \$10 saved as compared to treatment," Olszewski said.

"I hope they continue to grow," said Charlie Jacobs, a member of the Jacobs Family Foundation. "They serve a real need addressing children and at-risk youths that need that type of connection and therapy."


